General

- This document sets out the expected outturn for Wheldrake Parish Council's 2019-2020 budget as agreed by resolution of the full Parish Council at its meeting on December 11th, 2019.
- 2. Importantly, it sets out the budget for the year beginning April 1st, 2020 as approved at the Wheldrake Parish Council meeting on December 11th, 2019.
- 3. The budget as approved determined and Wheldrake Parish Council resolved that the Wheldrake Parish precept for 2020-2021 is £40,000.
- 4. This is a publicly available document and will be accessible on Wheldrake Parish Council's website and notice board.

Reserves

- 5. Reserves are shown on two lines of entry. The first is a committed reserve for replacement of equipment in the under-fives' area of the playpark which is the responsibility of Wheldrake Parish Council.
- 6. The second element of reserves is a general reserve sufficient to fund the essential day-to-day operations of Wheldrake Parish Council and may also be used for an immediate response to significant unforeseen events. The Parish Council resolved to discuss the level at which this reserve is set. This discussion will take place at the January 2020 meeting of the Parish Council. Should the Parish Council determine that the level of this reserve should be less than budgeted, the Parish Council will discuss and resolve how any surplus reserve sum should be allocated going forward.

Operational expenditure

- 7. This element of the budget sets out the anticipated expenditure on the day-to-day operations of Wheldrake Parish Council and each line of entry is referenced by a number within the notes set out after the table detailing the budget.
- 8. The budget does not constitute a commitment to incur expenditure and enter into contracts as the business case for each element is subject to further consideration by and resolution of the full council at either a regular or emergency meeting of the Parish Council.
- 9. The day-to-day expenditure includes the lengthsman's contract which is to be renewed following competitive tender.

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- 10. The costs of the Friday and Saturday evening bus service is substantially less than the £6,000 budgeted for 2019-2020. This is reflected in the 2019-2020 outturn. This represents a 62% share of the costs borne by parishes on the line-of-route of these services. It is unfortunate that the £6,000 figure continued in use right up to the budget meeting at which the former Chair of Wheldrake Parish Council and Ward Councillor in her statement made as a resident of Wheldrake at the start of the December 11th budget meeting of the Parish Council.
- 11. For 2020-2021, in the absence of the usage statistics on which the 2020-2021 commitment will be determined, the figure shown for 2020-2021 is the same as for 2020-2021. The Parish Council specifically resolved to continue to fund these services through 2020-2021 subject to timely access to the appropriate statistics from which Wheldrake's contribution will be determined and agreement reached between York City Council and all parishes on the line of route of these services.

Grants

- 12. While this paper sets out the budget for 2020-2021, this paper also includes the specific grants approved for or anticipated for payment in 2019-2020. The sum shown in 2020-2021 is available for applications made between April 1st and October 31st, 2020 for which approval will normally be given at the December 2020 meeting of the Parish Council.
- 13. The rules for Wheldrake Parish Council are contained within the Standing Orders of the Parish Council which are available on the Council's website or otherwise from the Parish Clerk who will manage the process leading to approval of grants by the full Parish Council.
- 14. Notes relating to grants are set out below the table that follows the table and are referenced by G followed by another sequential letter. These notes are set out beneath the notes relating to operational expenditure.

Projects

15. As with the operational expenditure, the lines of entry for the remainder of 2019-2020 do not constitute an authority to incur expenditure, except where indicated within the notes to the outturn and budget table. The notes pertinent to projects are indicated by the letter P followed by another sequential letter. These notes are set out beneath the notes relating to operational expenditure and grants
