Social distancing, hand sanitisation, disposable vinyl gloves; also, face covering if two or more working together to post signs specifying arrangements for the safe use of the playpark and inspecting prior to reopening</li><li>2. When spraying play equipment &amp; other surfaces with appropriate sanitising substance wearing personal protective equipment as specified by manufacturer when playpark otherwise unoccupied</li></ol>
	Public	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Access gate padlocked and notice posted indicating continued closure of playpark</li><li>2. Use of social media to amplify the park remaining closed and explain work required before the playpark is reopened</li></ol>

When work is required, the playpark to be temporarily closed, where possible on a pre-planned basis with the mitigation as set out for pre reopening (see above)</li></ol>
	Councillors	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. When spot-checking that arrangements for the use of the playpark are being respected; 2 metre social distancing, hand sanitisation and when less than 2 metre social distancing is necessary, face coverings</li></ol>

Weekly spraying of play equipment & other surfaces with appropriate sanitising substance wearing personal protective equipment as specified by manufacturer when playpark closed on a pre-planned basis (Sunday at 7.00pm)
	Public	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Weekly spraying by Parish Council of play equipment &amp; other contact surfaces (e.g. benches and gates) with appropriate long-life sanitising substance</li><li>2. Playpark divided into four zones, each with a maximum number of children and adults who can be in the zone at any one time</li><li>3. In zones 1,2 &amp; 3 within zone adult supervision required for each group of children from no more than two households</li><li>4. Signs to demarcate zones and set-out social distancing and personal hygiene posted at entrance to park and within each zone</li><li>5. Adult supervisors asked to ensure that they and the children they are supervising wash their hands before visiting the playpark and to sanitise their hands before use of each element of play equipment within the playpark and wash their hands after leaving the playpark</li><li>6. Adult supervisors to wipe down contact surfaces of equipment before use by children in their charge if they wish to add to the efficacy of mitigation one</li><li>7. In zone 4 (the MUGA – multi-use games area) adult supervision not required for children age 11 and over. However, these users of the playpark need to follow mitigation five as above</li><li>8. Entrance area and path - two metre social distancing applies</li><li>9. No food and drink and/or 'cycles within the park</li><li>10. Additional litter bin capacity for wet-wipes etc in the form of a CoYC grey wheelie bin subject to agreement of CoYC to empty</li><li>11. Randomly timed inspection by councillors of the playpark to determine if mitigations two to eight above are being followed</li></ol>
